



Fig. 175 à 177. - Le David de Hunley reconstitué d'après les dessins de M. William-A. Alexander (1863).

Hunley is returned to surface after 135 years

ADOCATED PREM

Ourieston -- The Coslederate submarine H.L. Hanley was lafted from the Adantic Ocean today, more than 135 years after it became the farst sub to sink an eventy warshe and then disappeared into the water.

The submarine saik with size crow members in 1664 after ramming a spar with a charge of black powder into the buil of the Union blockade vessel Housetsnik. It was pulled from about 30 feet of water about 4 miles off Sullivers Island shortly before 9 Am.

To raise the wased, divers slipped slings attached to a neel superstructure above the rob. The superstructure and the submarine were then lifted topether to begin the journey to the Charleston Harbor. Among those on hand for the event were Clive Coaster, whose expedition discovered the wreck in 1985, Gov. Jan Hodges and state Sen. Glens McConsell, chairman of the state Heatley Commission.

"It's just a sight to behold." McConsell asid. "It's an incredible sight. The sub -- it locks as sheek and everything as we thought." Casalee was at a loss for words.

"This sum?," be said. "It's a prest feeding." Hundreds of anilhouts, keyshers and pleasure orth hormond around the orane to wanth as workers secured the Hunley on the barge for the trip back to a conservation facility at the old Charleston Nory Base.

The minute the superstructure broke the surface. Confederate re-enactors fired a cannon volley from Sullivase bland at Reeach later, where the Hanky left on its all failed wyrage on Feb. 17, 1564.

Why the hand-cranked vessel made from locamotive boliers never returned is a mystery researchers hope to solve.

The expedition to raise the vessel began in May, but was delayed for about a month after a crune mounted on a barge proved unwisity. Officials later found a crune with lags that could be such in the ocean floor.





