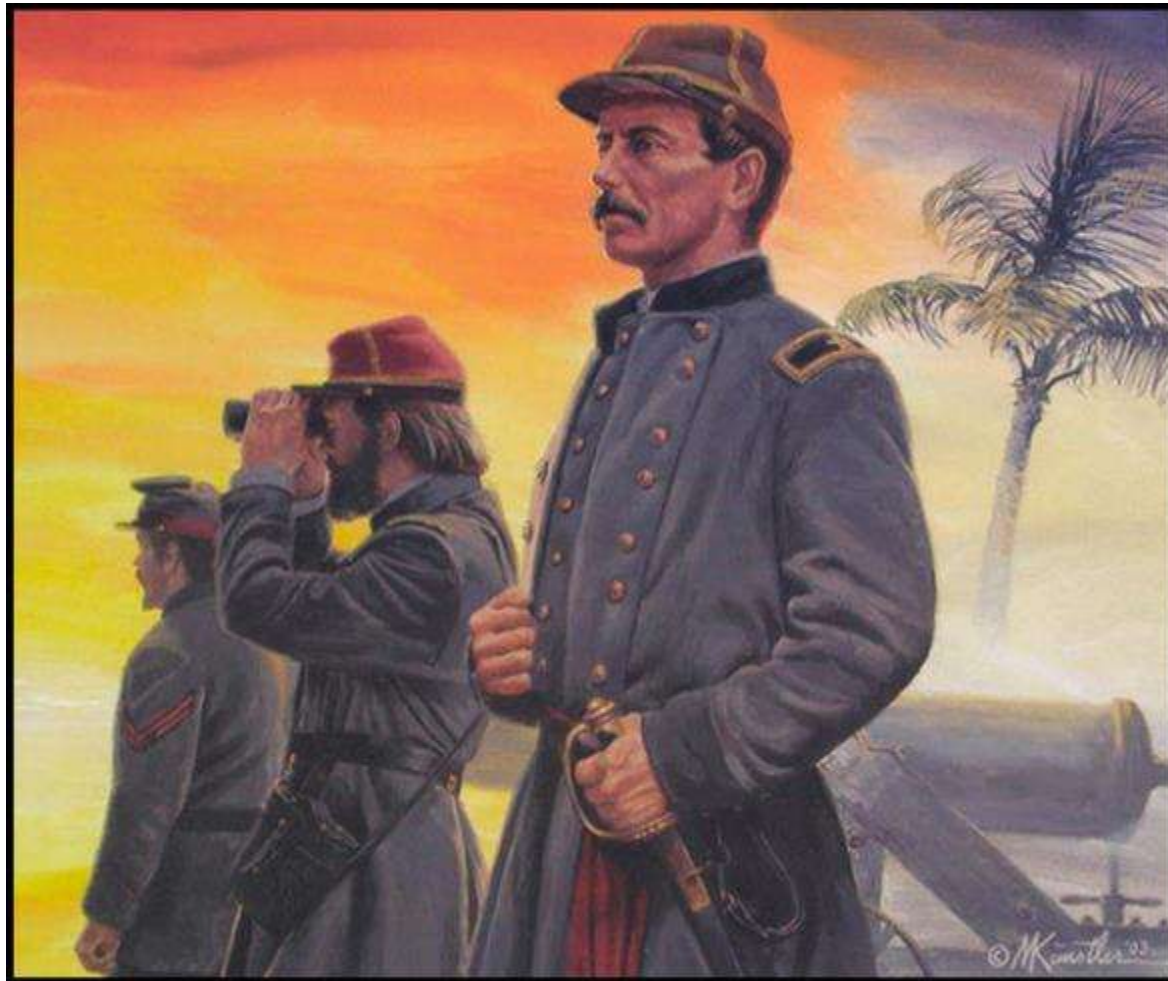

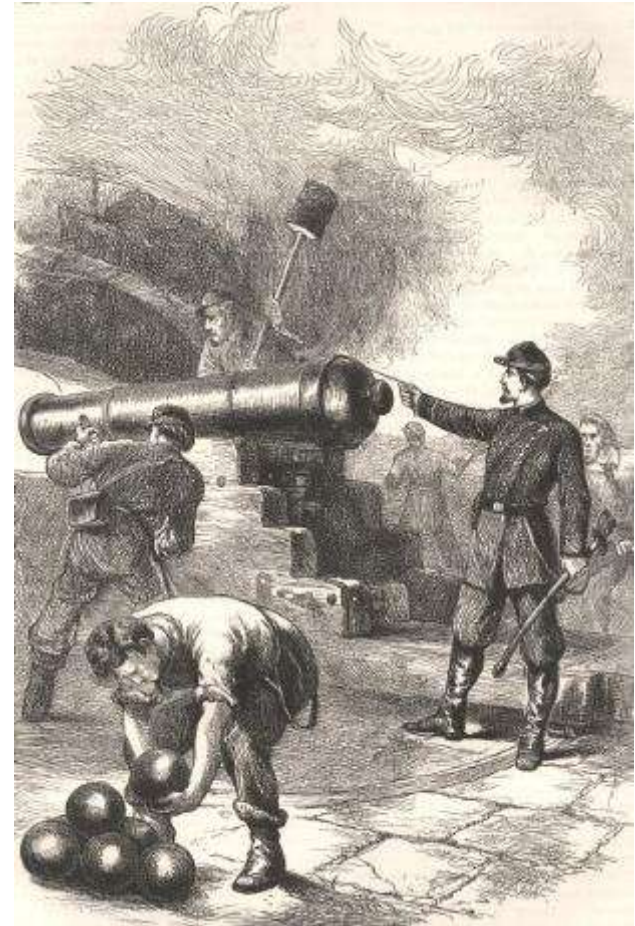

- Mar 6 Davis calls for 100k
- Mar 11 CSA Constitution
- Mar 28 Robert E. Lee Promoted to Colonel
- Apr 4 Virginia votes against Secession
- Apr 11 PGT Beauregard call for Surrender
- Apr 12 Ft. Sumter Fired On
- Apr 14 Maj Anderson leaves Ft. Sumter

 OUT OF THE FORT SUNDAY AFTERNOON THE FOURTEENTH INST. WITH
 COLORS FLYING AND DRUMS BEATING. BRINGING AWAY COMPANY AND
 PRIVATE PROPERTY AND SALUTING MY FLAG WITH FIFTY GUNS. ROBERT
 ANDERSON. MAJOR FIRST ARTILLERY. COMMANDING.

And we of freedom sacred rights

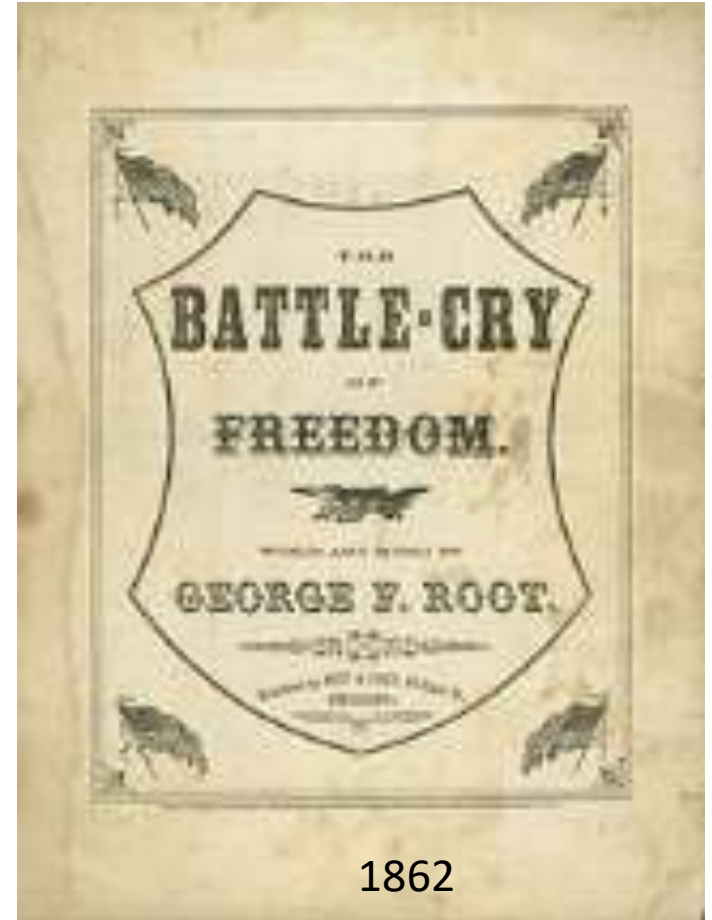
By trait'rous foes be plunder'd?

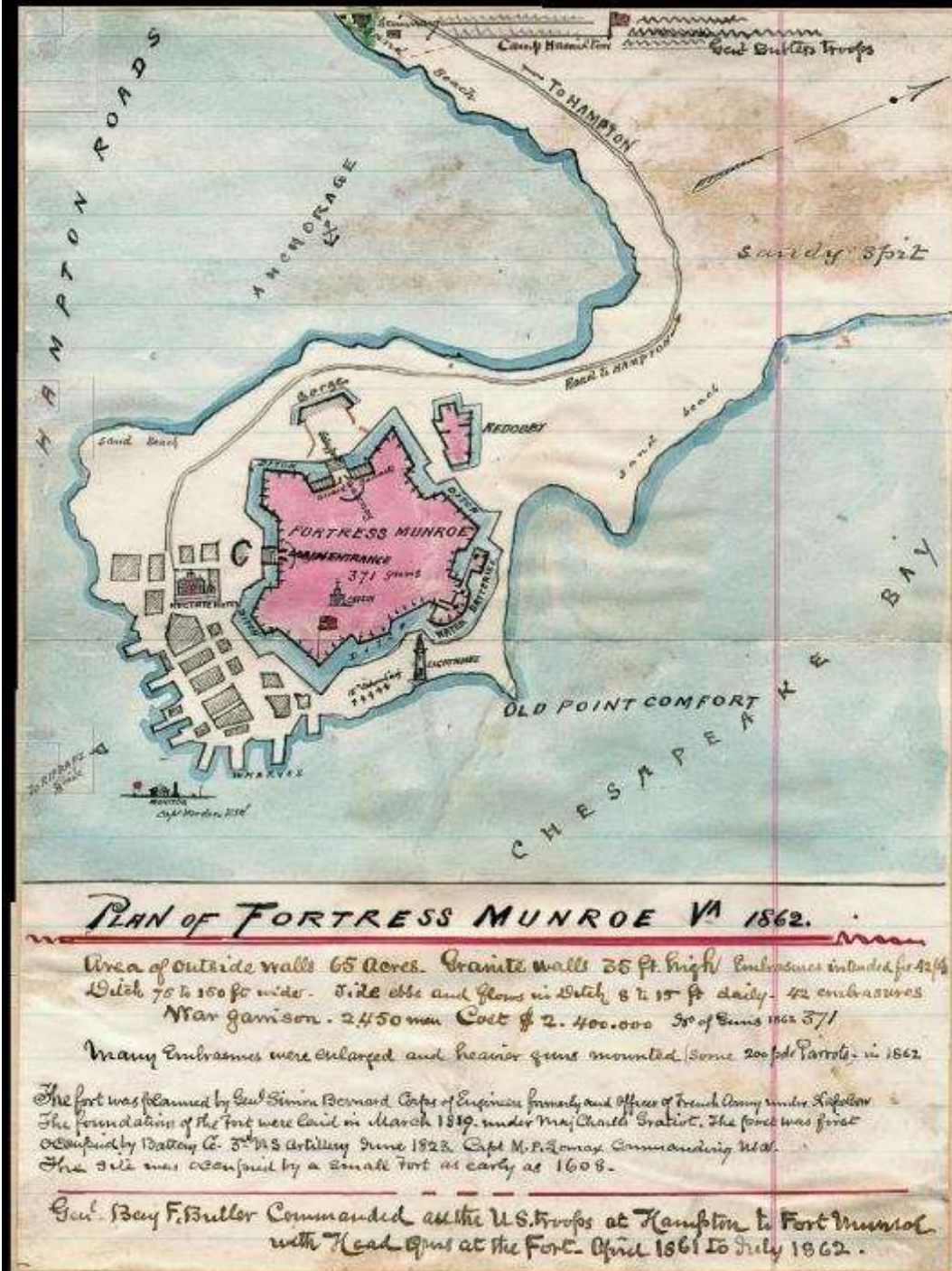


APR 19, 1861 ANACONDA PLAN



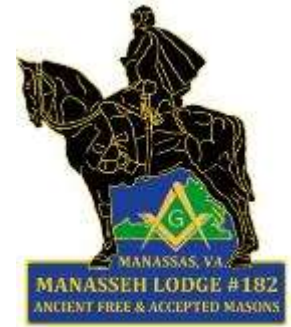


JUN 1861 ST TAMMANY LODGE NO 5

CONFEDERATE BATTLE FLAG REPLACES STAR AND BARS

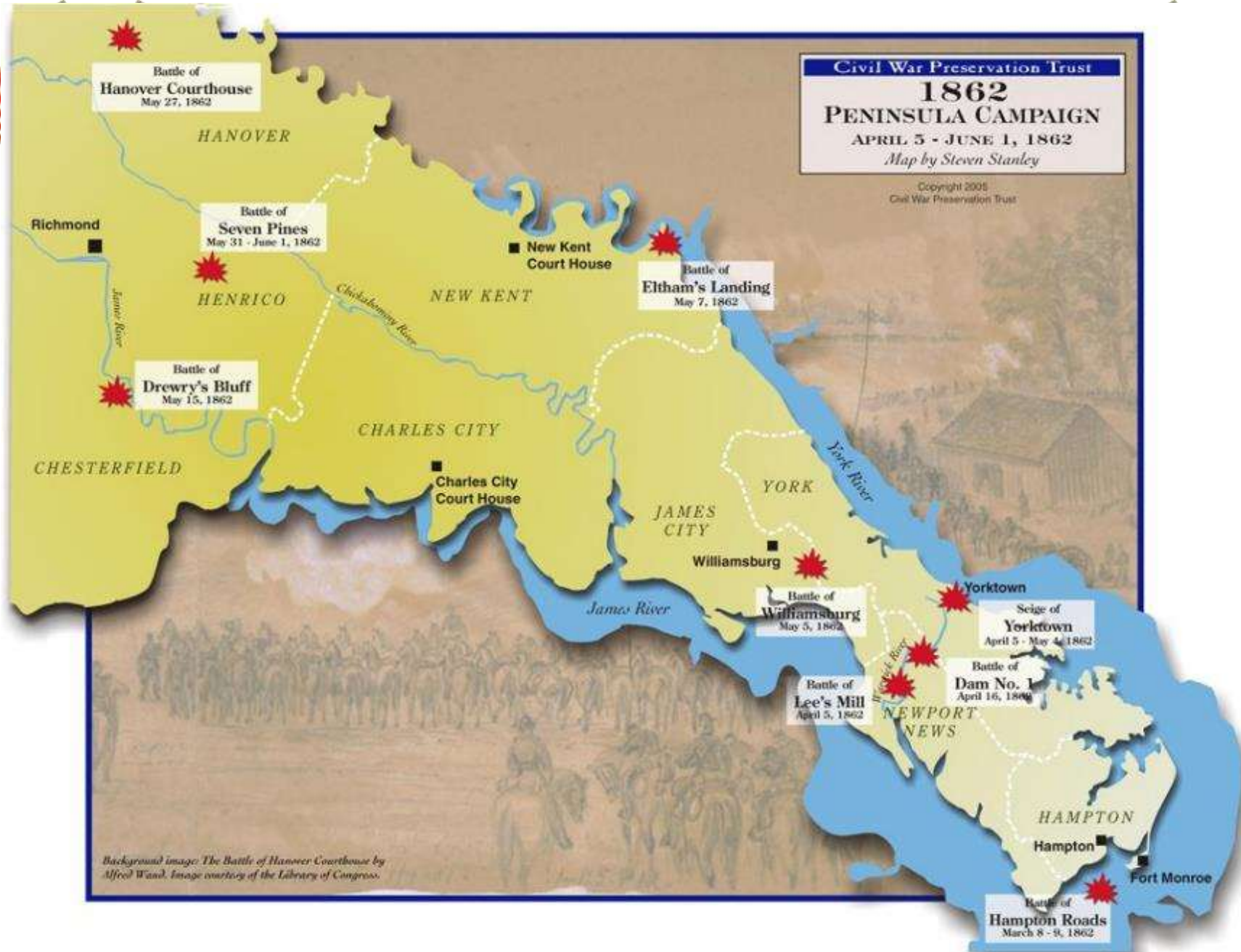

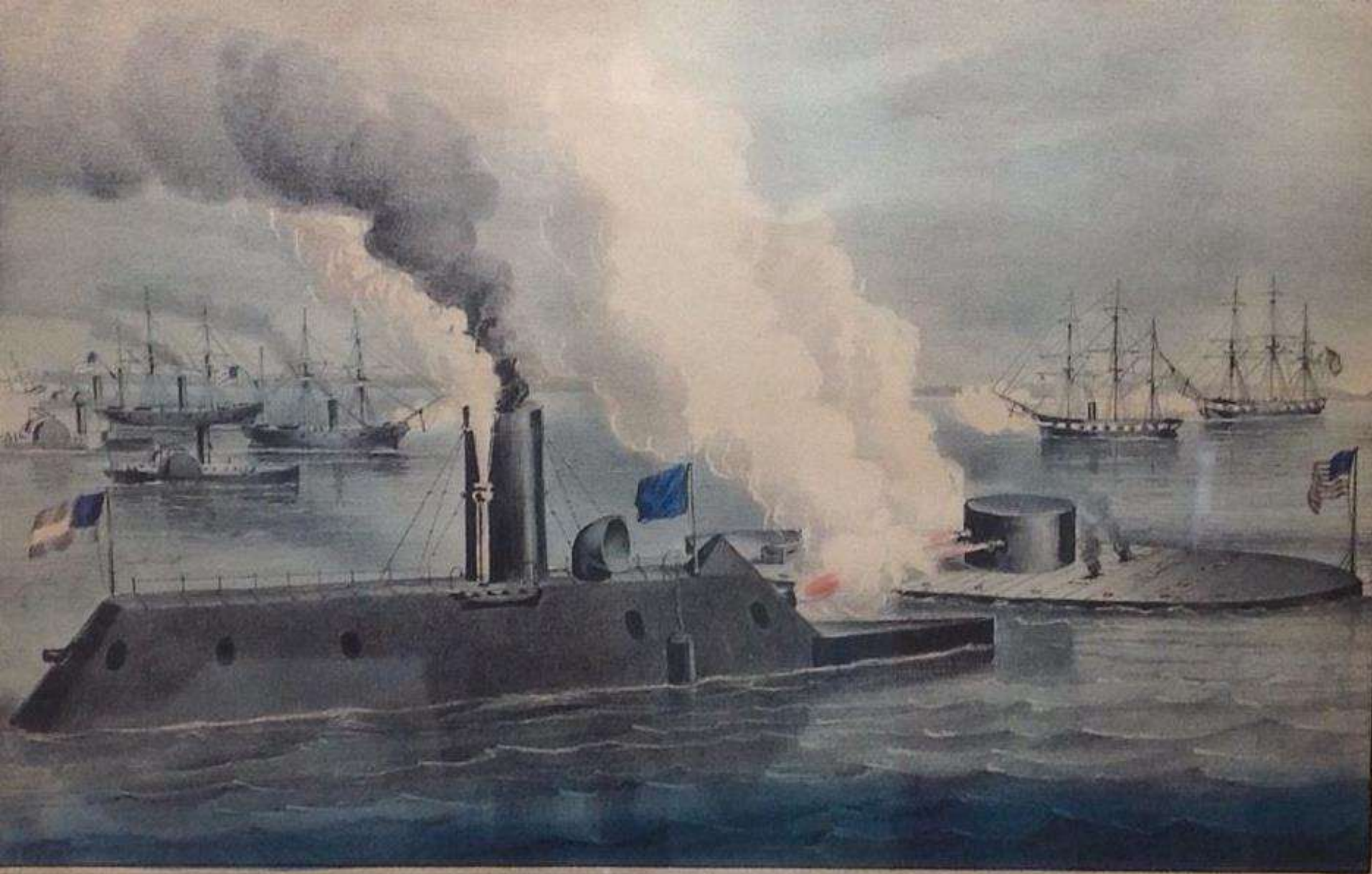

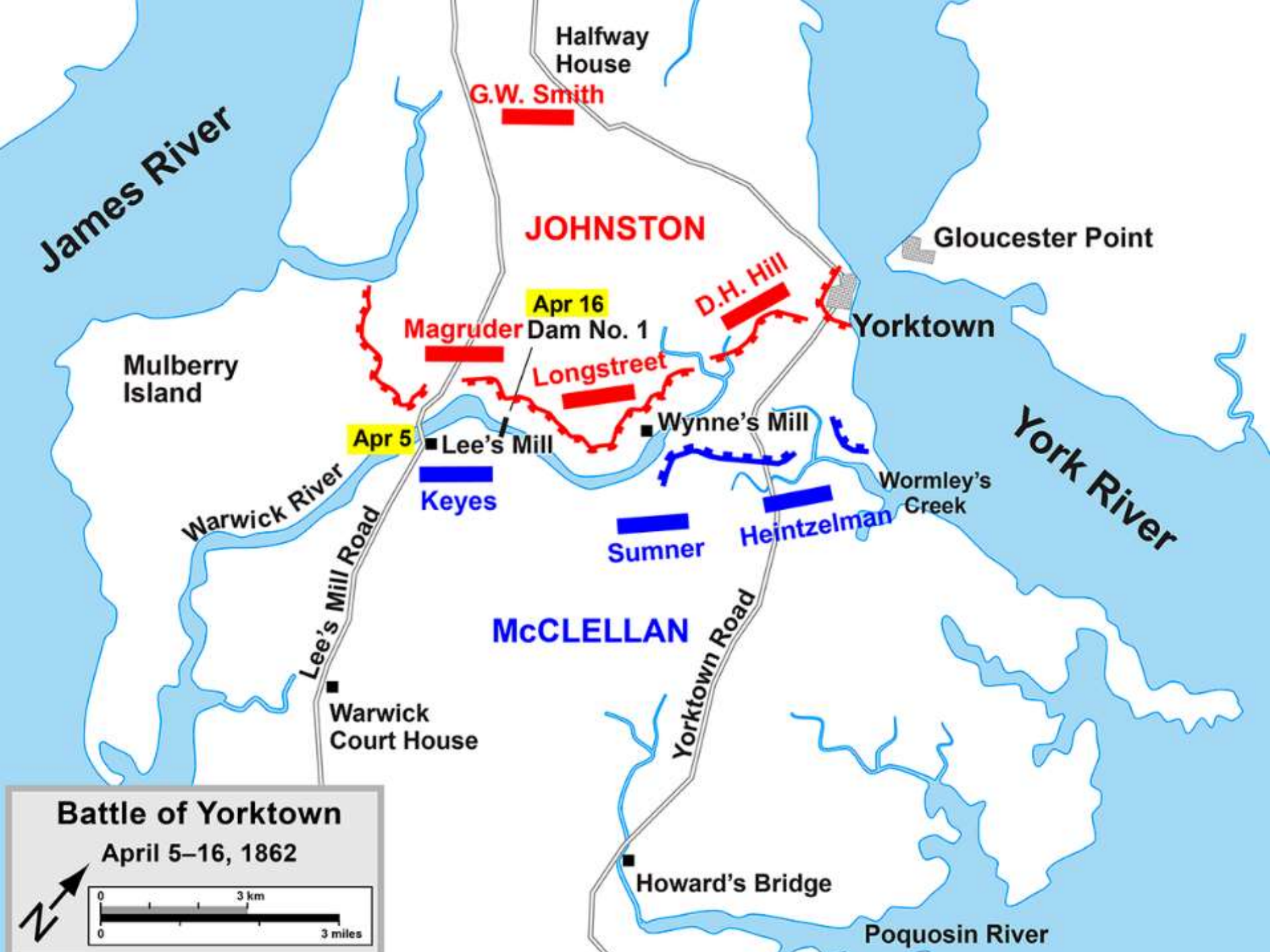
THE GREAT FIGHT BETWEEN THE "MERRIMAC" & "MONITOR", MARCH 9TH 1862.

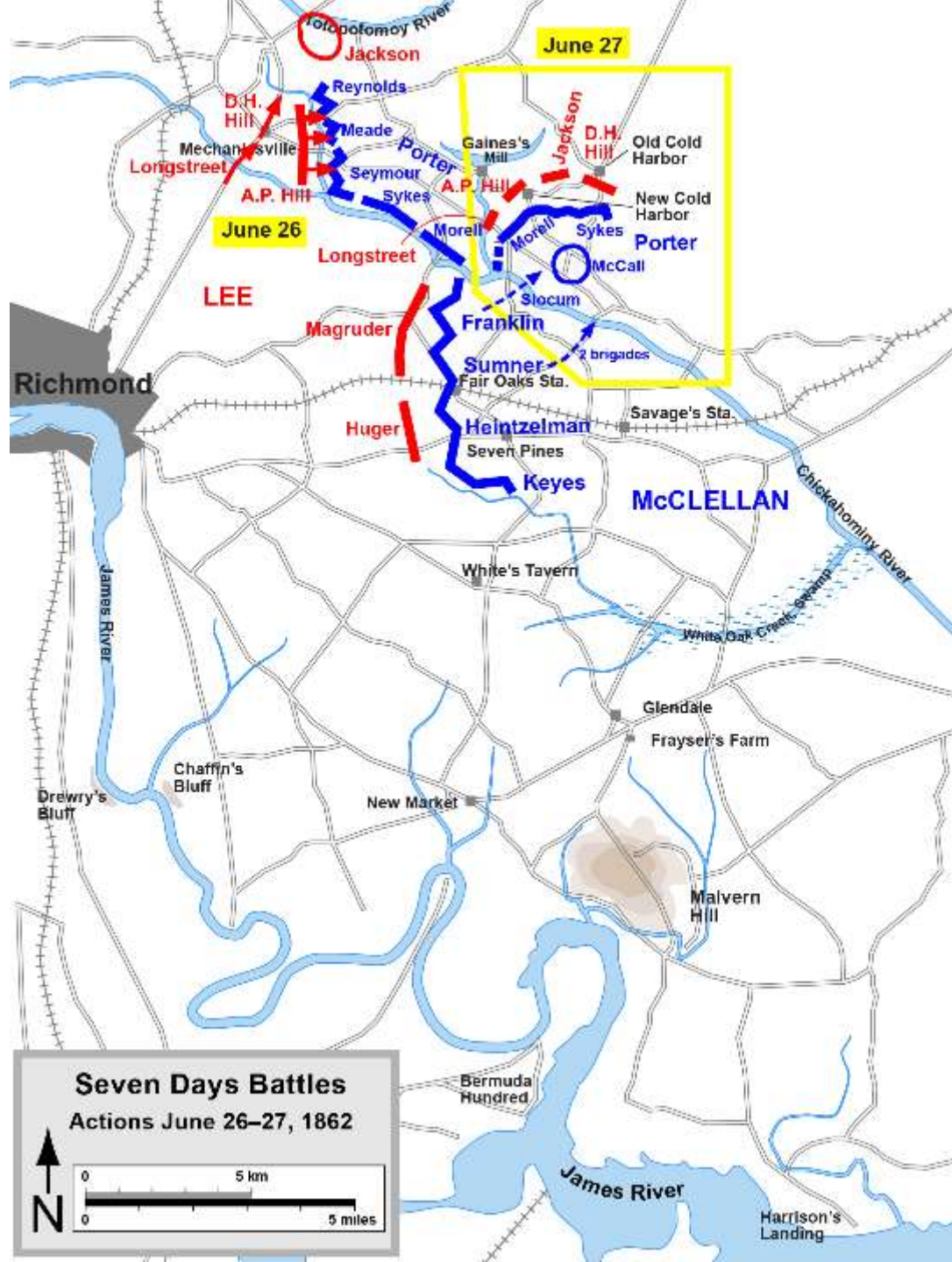

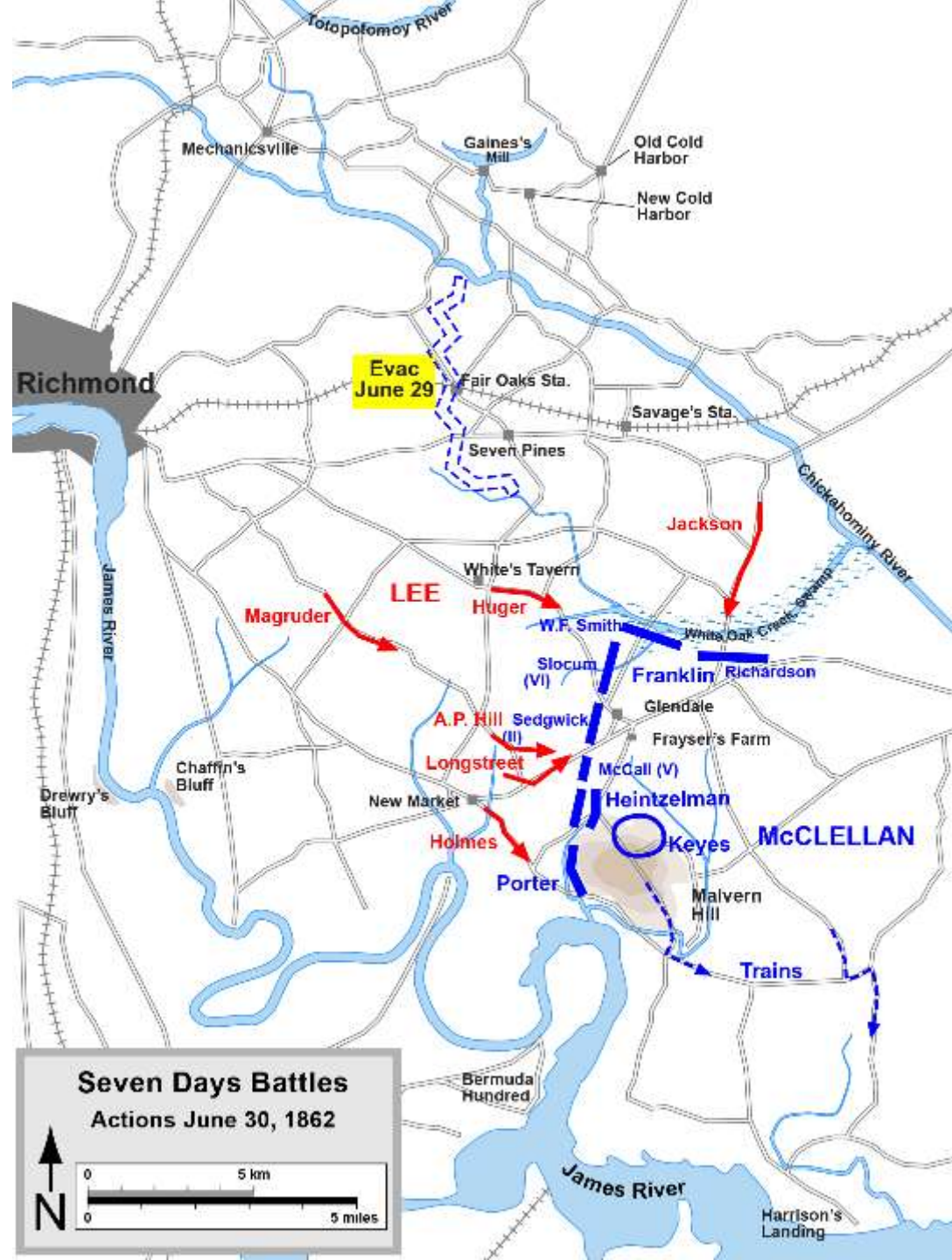

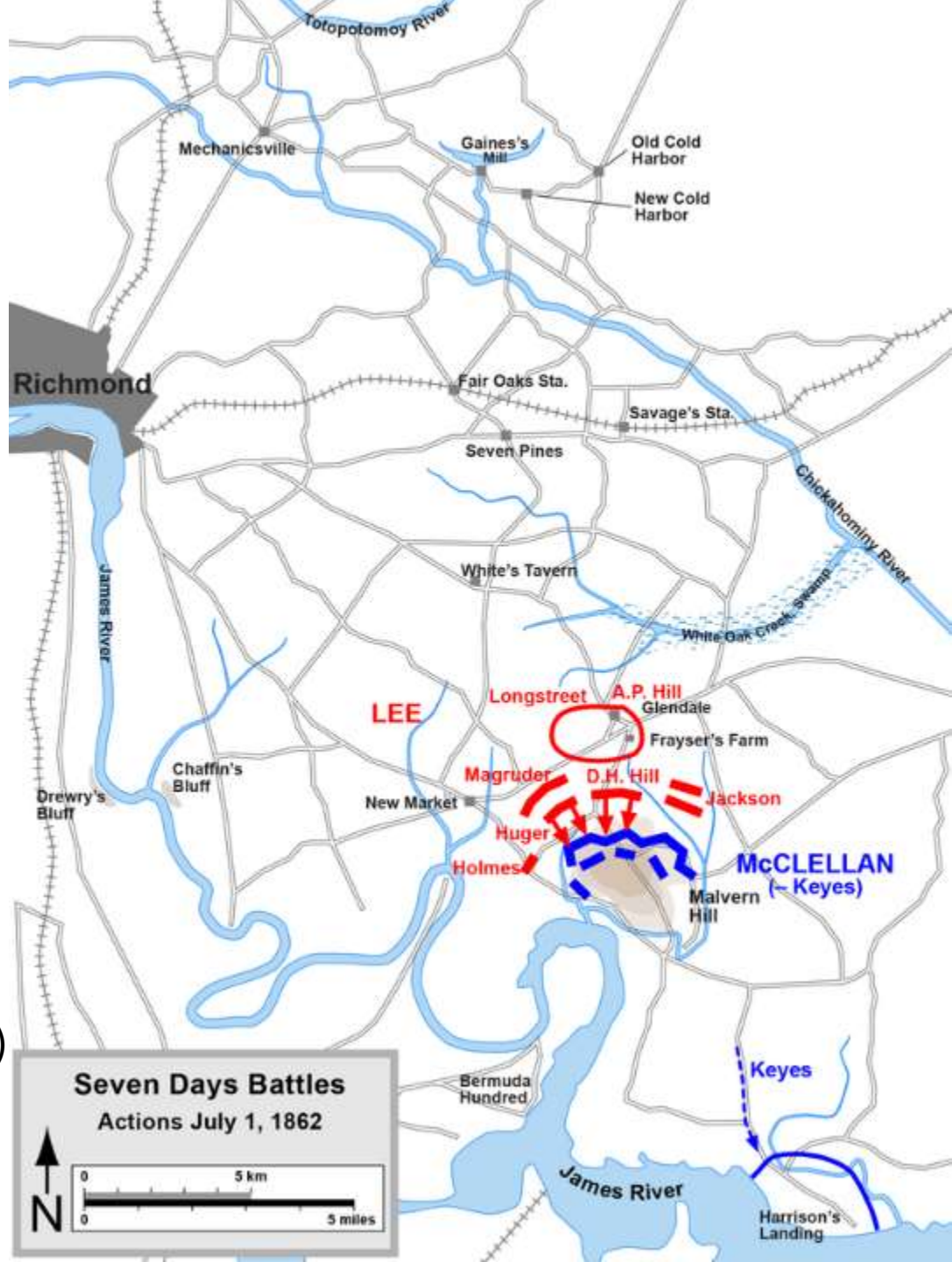

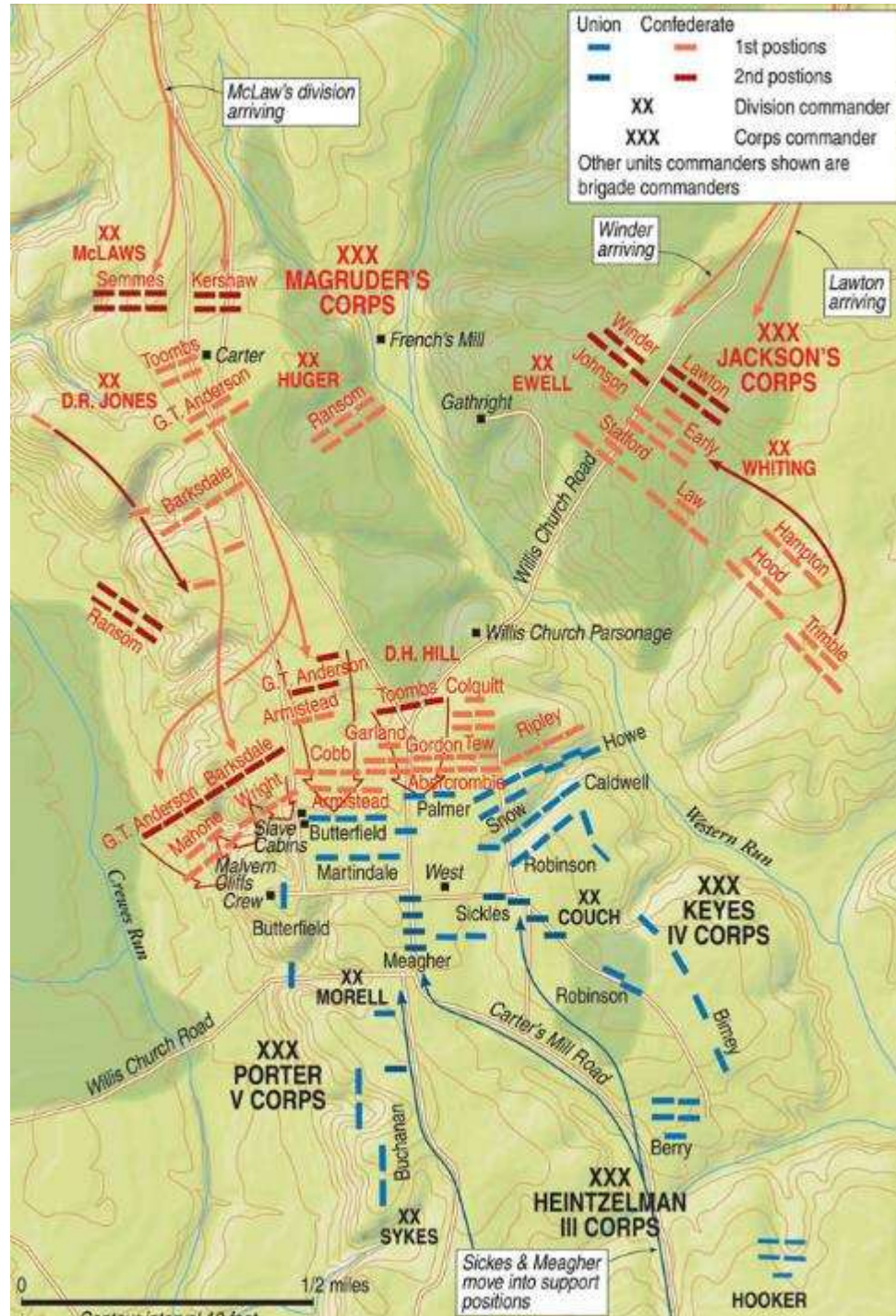

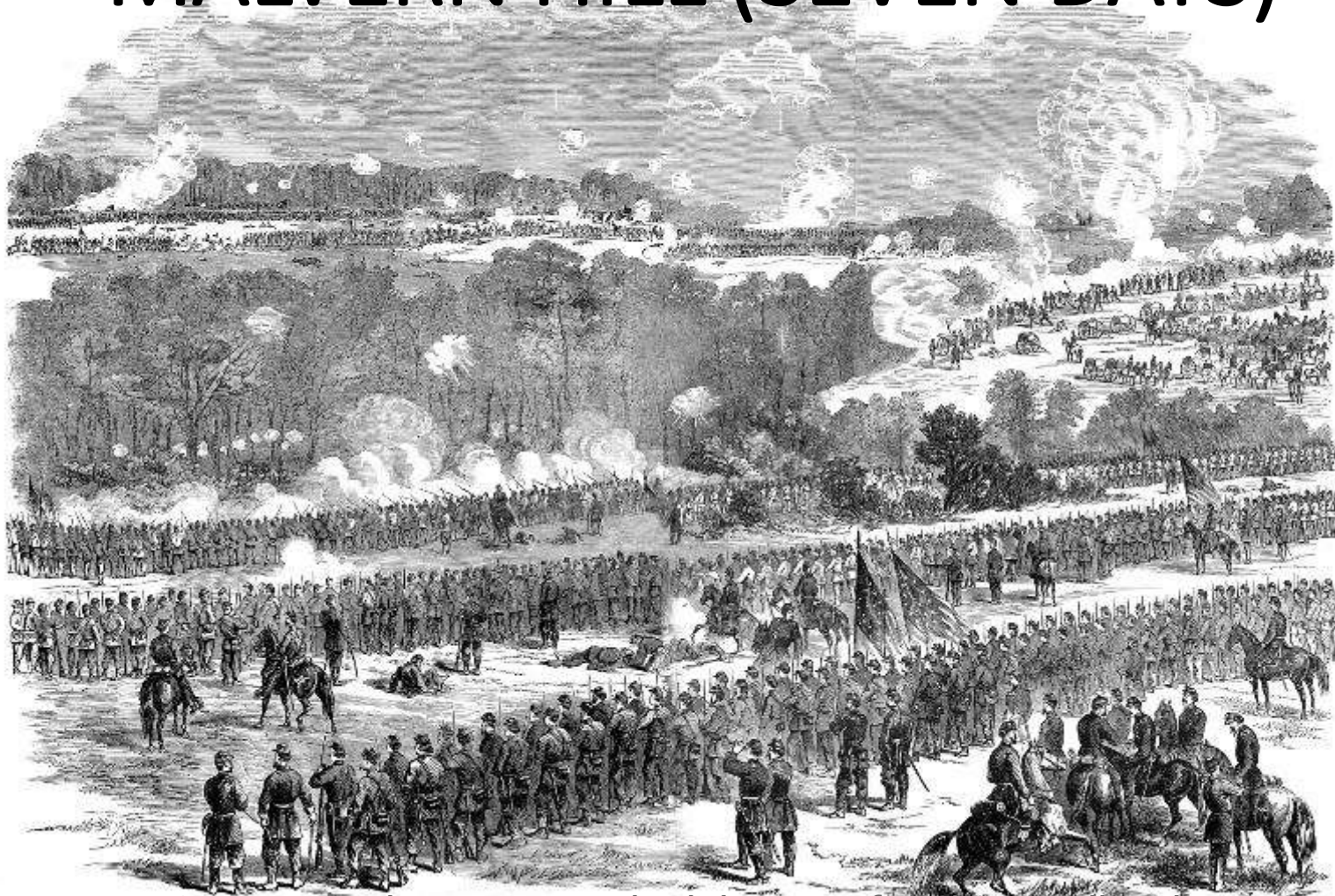
